

FAR 15.604 Unsolicited Proposal Preliminary Information

"It is the policy of the Government to encourage the submission of new and innovative ideas in response to Broad Agency Announcements, Small Business Innovation Research topics, Small Business Technology Transfer Research topics, Program Research and Development Announcements, or any other Government-initiated solicitation or program. When the new and innovative ideas do not fall under topic areas publicized under those programs or techniques, the ideas may be submitted as unsolicited proposals."

UNSOLICITED PROPOSAL DEFINITION

Unsolicited proposal means a written proposal for a new or innovative idea that is submitted to an agency on the initiative of the offeror for the purpose of obtaining a contract with the Government, and that is not in response to a request for proposals, Broad Agency Announcement, Small Business Innovation Research topic, Small Business Technology Transfer Research topic, Program Research and Development Announcement, or any other Government-initiated solicitation or program. (FAR 2.101)

CONTENT OF UNSOLICITED PROPOSALS

RESPONSIBLE PROSPECTIVE CONTRACTORS AND ORGANIZATIONAL AND CONSULTANT CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Offerors of unsolicited proposals shall be subject to the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) requirements of <u>subpart 9.1</u> – "Responsible Prospective Contractors" and <u>subpart 9.5</u> – "Organizational and Consultant Conflicts of Interest".

ADVERTISING MATERIAL, COMMERCIAL ITEM OFFER AND CONTRIBUTION

Advertising material, commercial item offers, or contributions, as defined in <u>15.601</u>, or routine correspondence on technical issues, *are not unsolicited proposals*.



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The preferred methods for submitting ideas/concepts to the Government, such as any agency: upcoming solicitations; Broad Agency Announcements; Small Business Innovation Research programs; Small Business Technology Transfer Research programs; Program Research and Development Announcements is through the specific instructions appropriately described for any applicable and announced effort as these efforts are established/organized and/or become available.

"UNIQUE" AND "INNOVATIVE"

Specifically, a "unique, innovative" product or service idea or approach would be a sole, inventive conception, unusual, and/or without a like or comparable idea or approach.

For example, a proposed unique and innovative product or service idea or approach which is similar or comparable in purpose, concept, design, etc., to those supplies and services offered under the "GSA Federal Supply Multiple Award Schedule (MAS) contracts" would **not** be considered "unique and innovative".

It is the policy of the Government to encourage the submission of new and innovative ideas in response to Broad Agency Announcements, Small Business Innovation Research topics, Small Business Technology Transfer Research topics, Program Research and Development Announcements, or any other Government-initiated solicitation or program. When the new and innovative ideas do not fall under topic areas publicized under those programs or techniques, the ideas may be submitted as unsolicited proposals.

This office is in receipt of a request from a potential unsolicited offeror for a preliminary meeting with Agency, "Agency Points of Contact" (e.g., SMEs and qualified personnel, etc.) as prescribed by FAR 15.204 "Exchanges with Industry Before Receipt of Proposals".

Potential Unsolicited Proposal Offeror:

Unsolicited Proposal Product/Service:

Preliminary meetings are scheduled and/or held at the *discretion* of the Government and include attendance by appropriate Government agency points of contact.

While there may be no present broad or solicited agency announcements/advertisements for the potential unsolicited proposal product/service, preliminary meetings/early exchanges may save considerable time and effort for all parties prior to the potential receipt of detailed unsolicited proposals or proprietary vendor/offeror information.

The purpose of exchanging information is to improve the understanding of Government requirements and industry capabilities. Any exchange of information must be consistent with procurement integrity requirements (see <u>3.104</u>). FAR 15.604 prescribes information that agencies make available to potential unsolicited proposal offerors in connection with preliminarily scheduled introductory meetings.

Unsolicited Proposal – Use of Data Limited

If a contract is awarded on the basis of this proposal, the terms of the contract shall control disclosure and use. This notice does not limit the Government's right to use information contained in the proposal if it is obtainable from another source without restriction. This is a Government notice, and shall not by itself be construed to impose any liability upon the Government or Government personnel for disclosure or use of data contained in this proposal.

Subject: Request for FAR Subpart 15.6 Unsolicited Proposal Comprehensive

Review

It is the policy of the Government to encourage the submission of new and innovative ideas in response to Broad Agency Announcements, Small Business Innovation Research topics, Small Business Technology Transfer Research topics, Program Research and Development Announcements, or any other Government-initiated solicitation or program. When the new and innovative ideas do not fall under topic areas publicized under those programs or techniques, the ideas may be submitted as unsolicited proposals.

This office is in receipt of the subject unsolicited proposal. In accordance with Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) 15.606-2, a "Comprehensive Evaluation" is required by the appropriate technical, or subject-matter expert and/or qualified personnel.

As prescribed by FAR 15.606-2, comprehensive evaluations shall consider the following factors and all other appropriate factors for the particular proposal.

The evaluation shall consider whether or not the unsolicited proposal demonstrates:

1. Unique, innovative and meritorious methods, approaches, or concepts, demonstrated by the proposal, including whether or not, (a) the *substance* of the proposal is available to the Government without restriction from another source or (b) resembles a pending competitive acquisition requirement.

"Unique" and "Innovative"

Specifically, a "unique, innovative" product or service idea or approach would be a sole, inventive conception, unusual, and/or without a like or comparable idea or approach. For example, a proposed unique and innovative product or service idea or approach which is similar or comparable in purpose, concept, design, etc., to those supplies and services offered under the "GSA Federal Supply Multiple Award Schedule (MAS) contracts" would not be considered "unique and innovative".

2. Overall scientific, technical, or socioeconomic merits of the proposal;



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- 3. Potential contribution of the effort to the agency's specific mission, including whether or not the *substance* of the proposal relates to the activity (Division, Office, etc.) mission;
- 4. The offeror's capabilities, related experience, facilities, techniques, or unique combinations of these that are integral factors for achieving the proposal objectives;
- 5. The qualifications, capabilities, and experience of the proposed principal investigator, team leader, or key personnel critical to achieving the proposal objectives; and,
- 6. The realism of the proposed cost, and whether appropriate funding is available.

Please include in your evaluation any offeror proposed energy-saving performance objectives in accordance with 10 CFR 436.33(b).

Upon completion of the evaluation, written recommendations for contract negotiation and award or the rejection of unsolicited proposals shall be provided to the Office of Procurement Agency ("Agency Contact Point") in accordance with the aforementioned factors as prescribed by FAR 15.606-2.

List the reason(s) and provide explanation(s)/finding(s) and determination(s) for rejecting the unsolicited proposal.

The cover document contained herewith titled, "Unsolicited Proposal – Use of Data Limited" shall remain and be handled with the unsolicited proposal at all times. In accordance with FAR 15.608, Government personnel shall not use any data, concept, idea, or other part of an unsolicited proposal as the basis, or part of the basis, for a solicitation or in negotiations with any other firm unless the offeror is notified of and agrees to the intended use. However, this prohibition does not preclude using any data, concept, or idea in the proposal that also is available from another source without restriction. Government personnel shall not disclose restrictively marked information included in an unsolicited proposal. The disclosure of such information concerning trade secrets, processes, operations, style of work, apparatus, and other matters, except as authorized by law, may result in criminal penalties under 18 U.S.C.1905.

While unsolicited proposals contain offeror designated acceptance periods (suggested period is 6 months), initially, thirty (30) days shall be provided to complete evaluations. Requests for additional time to complete evaluations should be provided in written format and include the scheduled date for completion.
